



Louise Pelt was born in Hamburg in 1982. After traveling the world early on with a children's opera choir, she studied English and German language and literature and then wrote for film and the theater for several years. She lives with her family between the Alster and Elbe rivers. **Paris in 2019**. There is actually nothing standing in the way of Mylène's happiness. But then a shocking revelation turns her whole world upside down. Mylène asks herself: is happiness even possible if you don't know who you are?

The German Democratic Republic, near the border, **in 1987**. Johanna, who is a hermit, discovers a 17-year-old girl in the forest and hides her from the troops along the border. This results in an unexpected confrontation with a past she thought she had long overcome. Happy memories from bygone days begin to resurface as well. When her mother falls ill with cancer, and her 16-year-old son wants to attend school in England for a year, Valerie finds herself wedged between two existential conflicts. While she would like to break free from the dysfunctional relationship with her mother, she is not permitted to do so; she has to let go of the child that has been the center of her life for more than fifteen years, but she's not ready to do that either. Yet every conflict has its backstory. Beginning with the childhood of Valerie's grandmothers, the author sheds light on the family's past, gradually revealing an intergenerational portrait of its women and focusing on the novel's central themes of saying farewell to loved ones, a longing to remain unscathed, and the desire ultimately to escape the baggage of one's own legacy.
